Dr. Victoria Harlan has been the Nurse Manager of the Cherokee Indian Hospital Authority's Emergency Room for 13 years. As an EBCI tribal member, she has dedicated her career to serving her community. Starting as a Registered Nurse with an Associate's Degree, she later obtained a Bachelor's in Nursing from Western Carolina University and recently completed her doctorate degree in Nursing Leadership/education. Dr. Harlan's leadership has transformed the ER department, increasing staff and improving care.

She has earned several accolades, including the Hayes Award in 2012, and the North Carolina Emergency Nurses Association's ER Nurse Manager of the Year in 2016.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, she advocated for self-care and set an example by being the first tribal member to receive the vaccine. Dr. Harlan's genuine intuition, empathy, compassion, and leadership make her highly respected within the community. She is akin to Ms. Lula Owl-Gloyne, a trailblazer of Native American healthcare, as both have made a lasting impact on the hospital and community.
